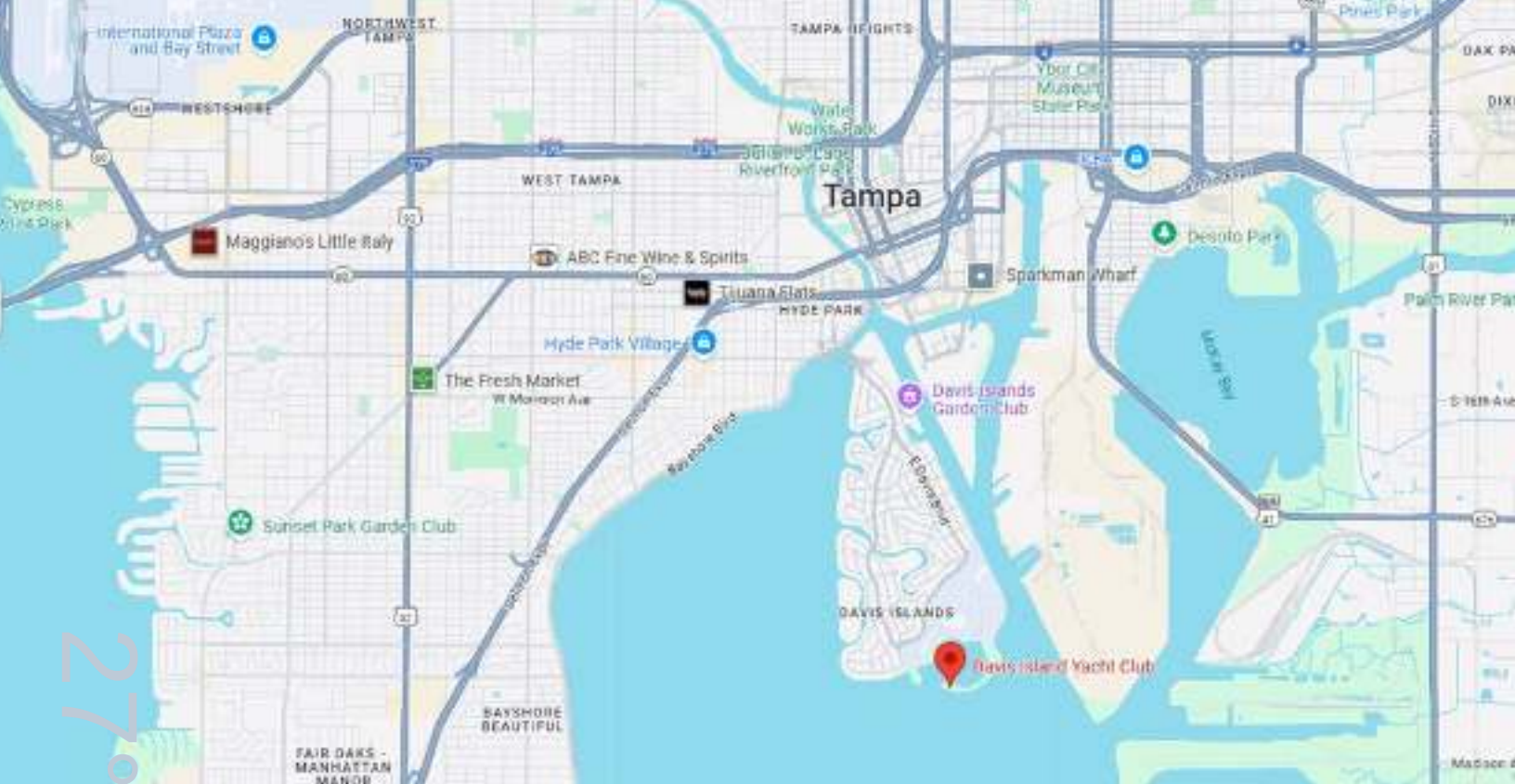

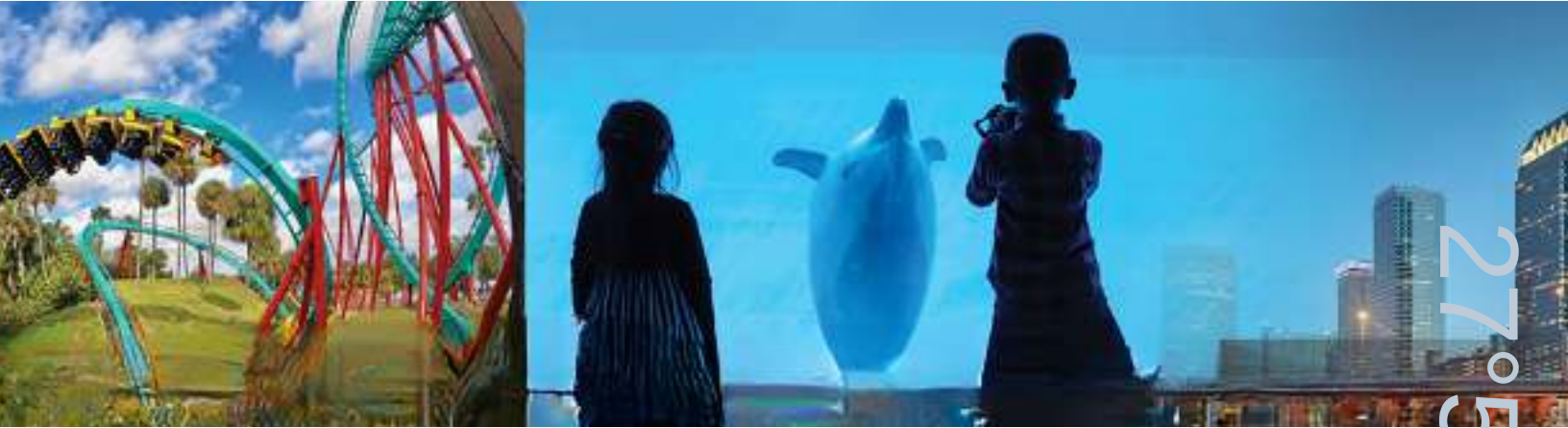

For marine life enthusiasts, the Florida Aquarium offers hands-on experiences and a massive coral reef exhibit, while ZooTampa at Lowry Park is home to exotic animals and interactive wildlife experiences. For a taste of Tampa's culture, explore the Tampa Riverwalk, a scenic waterfront path connecting top attractions like the Glazer Children's Museum, the Tampa Museum of Art, and the lively bars and restaurants at Armature Works. When DP Davis developed Davis Islands, he formed a Davis Islands Yacht Club with Ceasar Irsch, his "Director of Activities" as Commodore. For several years (1925 & 1926) they sponsored a regatta for power boats, one class of which was known as The Tampa Babies – mahogany "725 Cubic inch runabouts". Apparently, the Club ceased to function when the land bust occurred, but the idea didn't die.

History of the Sailingest Club in the South

In the early 1930's, the sailors in Tampa had developed a sailboat class known as the "Tampa Bay 16-Footer". There were no restrictions as to equipment, sails, hiking boards, etc., except that the boat could not exceed 16 feet. The sailboat became one of the first class boats raced in Tampa Bay and resulted in some of the keenest competition in our history. This group of sailors called themselves the Tampa Sailing Squadron.

In 1933 the group was chartered as The Tampa Sailing Squadron and by a coin toss, Bobbie C. Davis was "elected" the first Commodore. One of its early locations was the caretaker's cottage behind the Davis Island Tennis Court.

In 1935 the Sailing Squadron moved to Marjory Park and on August 15, 1941, it changed its name to Davis Island Yacht Club. In 1935 the Club began the sponsorship of the first long distance coastal sailing race on the West Coast of Florida, the "Egmont Key Race". It has been run annually since 1935 except for the war years.

In 1942 the Club ceased to function actively as all the members had answered the call of their country to serve in World War II and the Clubhouse was leased to the Coast Guard. It was approximately 1946 before the Club began to function again.

In the mid 1940's, Davis Island Yacht Club undertook the sponsorship of two major regattas-the Gasparilla Regatta and the Thanksgiving Regatta and today the Thanksgiving Regatta is one of the largest class regattas sponsored on the West Coast of Florida. In 1947, Lightning Fleet #164 constructed some docks in the Seaplane Basin and they were the first docks for sailing located there. In the late 1940's DIYC had obtained some lots from the city on the end of Davis Island to eventually build a clubhouse on the location.

In 1955, after much negotiation with the City of Tampa, including legislation in Tallahassee in order for the land and water surrounding it be available for sailing activities, they traded those lots for a lease from the City of Tampa for the strip of land on the south end of the Seaplane Basin for a club house. After a bond issue to fund the construction, the Clubhouse was completed in 1956 on the southern tip of Davis Islands.





In 1960, after a second bond issue and retirement of the first bond issue, more construction was planned. The facilities at DIYC underwent a major expansion adding the present swimming pool, seawall and the initial docks at the Club as well as enlarging the kitchen facilities. Since then porches were added, the bar was expanded, the docks and dry slips were expanded, and two hoists were added, one with a floating dock. Over time, the Club's lease with the city was renegotiated and it now extends to 2041.

In the late 1980's and beyond, DIYC began hosting some new sailing events. In 1989, the Old Shoe Regatta began, a single-handed, no-class regatta. DIYC began hosting the Morgan Invasion in 2006, a regatta organized around boats designed by Charley Morgan. 2010 saw both the first Hangover Bowl, a regatta scheduled for January 1st, and the resurrection of the Tampa to Ft. Myers distance race. In 2013, DIYC hosted the first Hospice Cup in conjunction with the 28th Annual Morgan Invasion and raised \$100,000 in 2024.

In 2002 it became apparent that the existing Clubhouse would have to be replaced. As a result, a Building Committee was formed, plans were drawn up and financing was obtained. The existing Clubhouse was torn down in October 2003, a triple-wide trailer was moved in for temporary quarters and the groundbreaking ceremony for the new building was held on November 7, 2003. On October 22, 2004 the new Clubhouse was dedicated.

In 2005, construction on the Tiki Bar and the Regatta Room was completed. The Regatta room is used as a classroom, for regatta registration and as a meeting room. The Tiki Bar was removed after a few years and construction on the Regatta Bar and Pavilion area was completed in 2013. The extension for the bottom land lease on the DIYC property was signed in 2007 and a scoring hut was built out on the point. In 2015, a ramp for dinghy sailing on the Point was built and the floating docks were expanded and refurbished. Then in 2016, 8 slips on 'B' dock and 20 slips on 'C' dock were added along with power pods for electric and water.

DIYC member Jeff Linton received the 2007 US Sailing Rolex Yachtsman of the Year Award after winning the Lightning World Championship as well as other prestigious competitions. In 2011, The National Sailing Hall of Fame was formed with DIYC as one of the founding members.

In 2014, the first club launch Guardian was decommissioned and replaced with an Island Hopper 30 pilot house, Guardian II. The transom from Guardian, was mounted on the side of the clubhouse in December 2016 where the Tiki Bar stood. It is dedicated to the members that built her and the do-it-yourself spirit of the club.

When You Arrive

Vehicle Parking

During the regatta, vehicles must be parked outside the Club gates. Temporary access is permitted during launching prep (for bow numbers, decals, and mast setup) and during haul-out.



Boat & Trailer Storage

The Club has worked with the City of Tampa to allow parking and launching from the public beach in addition to from our Club property. Assignments for launching will be given closer to the date of the event.

Trailer Storage

Trailer parking locations will be assigned prior to your arrival. Please follow volunteer directions when positioning trailers on site.

Launching

Competitors will have access to the **three hoists** on site.

Registration & Race Headquarters

Registration and race logistics will be located in the Regatta Room on the ground level facing the Bay.

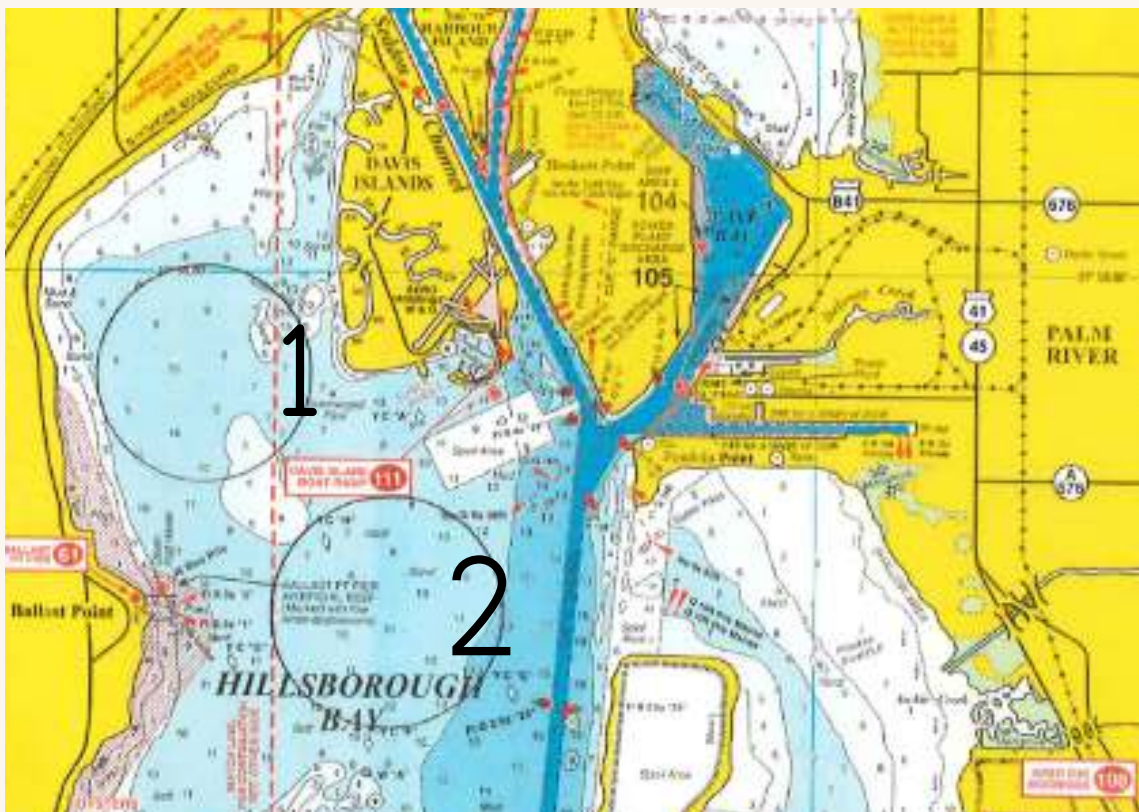

Boat Parking & Sailing Area

The Club is located next to a public beach designated for storage and launching purposes. This setup ensures that the Club's space stays accessible for members and guests who want to view the races from the Clubhouse. Trailers and containers will be positioned as close as possible to reduce walking distances.

Launching



Launching will be from the Davis Islands Beach & Seaplane Basin which is located next to the main gate for the yacht club.

Davis Islands Beach is a 200-foot-long sandy shoreline, providing a convenient launch area for small boats like A-Cats. The Seaplane Basin, just south of the beach, has a muddy bottom with some sandy patches, offering a protected area for launching and landing.

In November, winds are typically northeasterly, averaging 8-15 knots, creating favorable sailing conditions. The basin remains relatively calm due to its sheltered location, while the open bay offers steady breeze for sailing.

Medical Facilities and Safety

Tampa General Hospital

Tampa General Hospital is a private not-for-profit hospital and one of the most comprehensive medical facilities in West Central Florida serving a dozen counties with a population in excess of 4 million. As one of the largest hospitals in Florida, TGH is only a 5-minute drive away from DIYC.

Consistently recognized for world-class care, Tampa General Hospital is ranked as the #1 hospital in Tampa Bay by U.S. News & World Report for 2024-25 and is nationally ranked as among the top 50 hospitals in the nation in eight specialties. Additionally, Tampa General was ranked as “high performing,” or among the top 10% of hospitals in the nation, in five more specialties along with 12 procedures and conditions.

We take safety very seriously, and we will have safety personnel on the water and will be working with First Responders throughout the event.

Tampa Fire Station 17 is located on Davis Island and is very close to the water and DIYC. It has multiple forms of rescue vehicles including a rescue boat and marine trained staff.

Air Arrival

The Tampa Bay area is served by Tampa International Airport (TPA), Orlando International Airport (MCO), and St. Pete–Clearwater International Airport (PIE) for international flights.

- Tampa International Airport (TPA): Offers nonstop international flights to destinations in Europe, Canada, Central America, and the Caribbean. Notably, there are direct flights to London and Frankfurt.
- Orlando International Airport (MCO): Approximately 90 minutes from Tampa, MCO provides a broader range of international flights, including multiple direct routes to major European cities such as Dublin, London, Paris, and Madrid.
- St. Pete–Clearwater International Airport (PIE): Primarily serves domestic and seasonal international flights, with some service to Canada.



Car Arrival

Exit 1-275 at Ashley Street. Proceed south to Kennedy Boulevard and turn right. Proceed over the bridge to the first traffic light which is Hyde Park Avenue then turn left. Continue straight to the Davis Islands bridge which turns into Davis Boulevard and veer right at the fork onto West Davis Boulevard. Continue to the traffic circle. Yield and continue straight onto Severn Avenue. The Yacht Club is at the terminus of Severn Ave.

International Shipping and Logistics

DIYC is well-equipped to accommodate international competitors' shipping boats and gear for the 2026 A-Class Catamaran World Championships. Transworld Shipping USA (TWS) will manage international logistics to ensure a seamless shipping process.

The following guidelines outline the necessary procedures.

Key Shipping Requirements

1. Documentation

- A Commercial Invoice and Packing List is required, listing all shipped items with assigned values (EUR/USD/AUD).
- A Carnet is highly recommended to simplify customs clearance and avoid duty fees. Without a carnet, a commercial entry will be required, and duties must be paid upfront.

2. Booking & Shipping

- All ocean bookings must be made through Transworld Shipping USA (TWS) or its nominated agent.
- Shippers are responsible for coordinating container loading, ensuring all boats and gear are securely blocked and braced.
- If wooden packing materials are used, they must comply with ISPM15 regulations and be properly stamped.





International Shipping and Logistics

3. Equipment Free Time & Storage

- Standard container free time is 4 days, after which per-diem charges apply.
- Organizers are working on on-site storage solutions for international competitors.

4. Marine Insurance

- Ocean carriers provide limited liability (\$500 per shipment).
- Competitors are encouraged to purchase an All Risk Marine Insurance policy to protect against damage or loss.

5. Customs & US Import Procedures

- TWS will handle Importer Security Filing (ISF) requirements and customs clearance.
- A Power of Attorney (POA) is required for TWS to act as the clearing agent.

Return Shipping

- TWS will book return shipping within 4-6 days after the event ends.
- Shippers are responsible for reloading boats and securing gear.
- TWS will manage export documentation and return customs clearance.
